Volunteer activity as a means of formation of professional orientation of future specialists of social and humanitarian profile

Keywords: volunteer activity, professional orientation, future specialists of social and humanitarian profile.

Purpose of research – to justify theoretically and support methodically the formation of professional orientation of future specialists of social and humanitarian profile by means of volunteer activity.

Research methods: analysis of scientific and methodological literature, teaching experience, educational standards of the Republic of Belarus and training programs; questioning, testing, pedagogical experiment, ranking, correlation and statistical methods.

Obtained results and their novelty. Additional data on the key ideas of the genesis of volunteer activity are obtained. The level of scientific knowledge about the pedagogical conditions of volunteer activity organization in the context of formation of professional orientation of future specialists of social and humanitarian profile. The theoretical model of professional orientation of future specialists is created. The methods and organizational and methodological support of formation of professional orientation of future specialists of social and humanitarian profile by means of volunteer activity are developed.

Recommendations for use. Theoretical and methodological ideas are suitable for updating state educational standards, creating model and training programs; the model of professional orientation of future specialists is a guide for the development of alternative models of a specialist; methods of forming professional orientation, organizational and methodological support can be used for training future specialists in high schools, colleges, and in training and retraining system.
